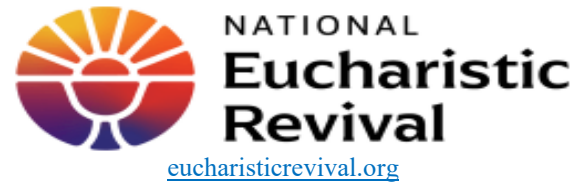
REST IN PEACE

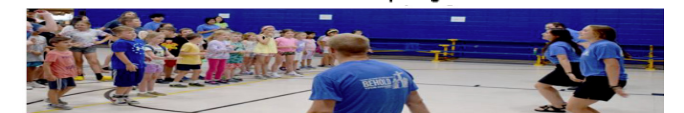
