Ahead of the National Eucharistic Congress, a Eucharistic Pilgrimage will bring Jesus from city to city across the U.S. lighting hearts on fire along the way. While pilgrimages have a long legacy within the Church, this is the first undertaken at such a scale—walking coast to coast with Our Eucharistic Lord! The four routes begin with kickoff events during the weekend of Pentecost, which is May 17-19, 2024. Each route will walk with Jesus across the country for approximately two months. All four groups will meet in Indianapolis on July 16 to attend the National Eucharistic Congress from July 17-July 21, 2024. Although none of the four pilgrimage routes come through the QCA, you can plan your own pilgrimage in many ways—from walking to Mass in the morning, traveling to a nearby holy site, or making a trip (better than the eclipse!) to meet up with Eucharistic Revival Pilgrimage along its way to Indianapolis. 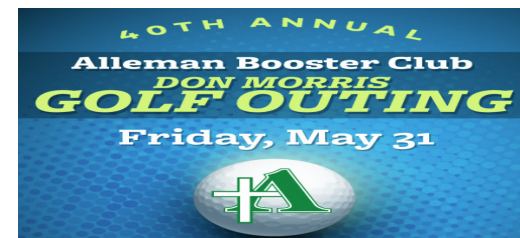
