**HAVE YOU HEARD?**  
 A new film focusing on the transformative power of the Eucharist will be hitting the big screen, including the Davenport Theater, June 4, 5 and 6 Only. Times 4:00 and 7:00 p.m. Deacon Steve Greco is the executive producer of the film. Greco explained that amid the ongoing Eucharistic Revival in the U.S., he felt it was very critical that we have a movie focusing on the real presence of Jesus with top Catholic theologians and leaders across the country and across the world.”

The movie is going to change people's lives because the most important thing for us right now is to understand how much God loves us,” he said. “And what the movie talks about is that Jesus is the personification of love through the Mass and through the Eucharist.” I believe the Holy Spirit has guided us in making this movie.”

He added that the film has a special focus on young adults due so many leaving the Church and their lack of belief. Hopefully, and we believe, they will realize that this is real. This isn't just a symbol. This isn't just a tradition. This is real. This is Jesus,” Greco emphasized. Another important demographic highlighted in the movie is the Hispanic population. Greco pointed out the fact that the Catholic Hispanic population is one of the fastest-growing populations in the Church and is on fire in many places.”

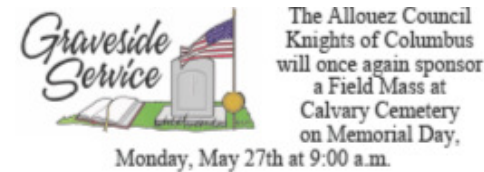
