Jubilee Year 2025

Pope Francis has invited "everyone to an intense experience of the love of God" and "calls on all Christians to become Pilgrims of Hope." Pilgrims of Hope is the theme for the 2025 Jubilee Year which will begin on December 24, 2024, with the opening of the Holy Door at the Basilica of St. Peter in Rome and will continue until the closing of the Jubilee Year on January 6, 2026.

Pope Francis has invited Catholics to renew our hope and discover a vision that can "restore access to the fruits of the earth to everyone." We are also invited to rediscover a spirituality of God's creation in which we understand ourselves as "pilgrims on the earth" rather than masters of the world. We are called to rediscover the spirituality God's creation and promote peace among nations.

Globally, thirty-five million pilgrims are expected to visit Rome for the Jubilee Year. As part of the Jubilee, pilgrims to any of the sacred sites will be able to obtain the grace of the Jubilee Indulgence under the usual Indulgence conditions. So what is a Jubilee Year. A Jubilee Year is also called a

"Holy Year." They are celebrated every 25 years within the Catholic Church. The focus is on forgiveness, reconciliation, spiritual renewal, faith reflection and pilgrimages to sacred sites. The Jubilee Year is above all about Jesus Christ. The origin of the Jubilee Year goes back to the Law of Moses where he prescribed a special year for the Jewish people, "You shall hallow the fiftieth year and proclaim liberty through-

out the land." (Lev 25:10-14) The celebration included the restitution of land to the original owners, the remission of debt, the liberation of slaves & the land was left fallow. In 1470 Pope Paul II changed the interval between Jubilee Years from 50-25 years.

Let us use this Advent as a time to prepare for the upcoming Jubilee Year. As Fr. Mark Thibodeaux says, "In Advent, God is calling us to step out our learned hopelessness and step into the river of hope."
